Major Tests of Our Faith – Lesson Four Disappointment in Other Christians

At times we struggle because of what we see in other Christians. New converts might look to those who have been in Christ for a longer time and think they have everything worked out in life and that they face no struggles. How hard it is on those babes when they come to realize that even mature Christians face challenges in faith. The babes could become disillusioned and disappointed or even give up their faith when they see other Christians stumble.

Sometimes it is the mature disciples who at first are excited and rejoice over one's decision to obey the gospel, but then are disappointed when the babe in Christ seems to struggle with issues of life. It could be that the babes are having a hard time pulling themselves from their entanglements in the world, and in seeing that it can dishearten even the established saint.

Imagine the disappointment, and even the frustration, of Paul when he learned that Peter was not being honest in dealing with some of the Gentile Christians ... that is, he was not treating them the same as the Jewish disciples. Peter knew better but even he got carried away in the hypocrisy of the moment. (**Gal. 2:11-14**)

Disappointment in other Christians can become a major test our faith.
