Major Tests of Our Faith - Lesson Five Sickness, Grief, Financial Setbacks

b. Give reasons why these afflictions proved to be such a test to Job's faith.		
c. In reality, and ultimately, who brought Job's afflictions upon him?		
2. What questions do people tend to ask when losses and setbacks come into their lives that may indicate they are struggling with their faith?		
3. Read John 9:1-3 .		
a. What question did the apostles ask concerning the man born blind?		
b. What was Jesus' answer?		

4. Read **Luke 13:1-5**. What is the point of Jesus' response?

5.	Read Philippians 4:10-13 and be prepared to discuss Paul's attitude toward afflictions and setbacks that he faced.
6.	What promise is found in Hebrews 13:5-6 ?
	a. What makes this promise valid?
	b. What personal applications might we make to this promise?
7.	Read the 23 rd Psalm and think about this What is there about this Psalm that has made it a source of comfort to so many in their grief and afflictions?
8.	When we are trying to encourage those facing adversity in life, reality forces us to admit that our answers do not always satisfy the one who is suffering. We must be careful to not be overly bold in our answers or we might become like Job's friends. a. What can we do to help a person maintain his faith under such circumstances?
